Psalm 2:6- I set my king upon my holy hill of Zion

Isaiah 63:2-5 – I have trodden the winepress alone....I will tread them in mine anger...

His name on their foreheads	The mark on their foreheads
No deceit in their mouth	Blasphemy against God, deceit

Questions to Consider

Verses 1-5

- Earthly scene or heavenly?
- Who are the 144,000? What harvest are they the firstfruits of?

Verses 6-13

- Is this everlasting gospel the gospel as we know it today?
- What does Babylon represent? An actual city? A kingdom?

Verses 14-20

- Is the one like the Son of Man actually the Lord Jesus?
- Are the harvest and vintage describing the same event?
